10. Guidelines/Suggestions for Teaching Methods and Student Learning Activities:

- Lectures: Provide contextual background and detailed analysis of each topic.
- Group Discussions: Facilitate discussion between students by having them use the key questions and answers outlined in the topic to encourage conversation in the tarjeta language.
- Document Analysis: Students analyze documents, maps, and images related to the course topics.
- Research Projects: Assign a group project on specific spanish speaking country to students working together,
 (4 or 5 students per group).
 This series as a Peer Teaching methods as well. Students teach their peers, which can reinforce their own learning and enhance their understanding.
- Video presentations: Students watch videos relevant to the course topic.
- Powerpoint presentations- students go through powerpoint presentations during the class, which guide the class discussion.
- Lecture-Demonstration: Combining lectures with demonstrations to enhance understanding through verbal and visual learning.

11. Guidelines/Suggestions for Methods of Student Evaluation:

- Quizzes and Tests: Regular assessments to check understanding of key concepts and knowledge of vocabulary in each topic.
- Classwork: Assignments completed during class that help monitor ongoing student progress and understanding.
- Homework Assignments: Tasks assigned for completion outside of class, reinforcing concepts taught and promoting independent study.

- Group Projects: Team assignments that assess collaborative and interpersonal skills along with individual contributions. Each person must speak and show they placed a role in the project coming to life.
- Peer Reviews: A process where students evaluate each other's work, providing feedback and gaining insights from peers.
- Final Exam: A comprehensive exam covering all course material.
